



Fire Evacuation Diagrams

Have you ever been involved in an emergency evacuation?

Whether involved in a practice drill or a real emergency, how fast people can get out safely will determine the true value of your evacuation procedures.

Fire Evacuation Diagrams are designed to inform staff, and visitors to the building, the quickest and safest way to evacuate in the event of an emergency. We can't always prevent an emergency, but we can certainly prepare in advance for an emergency to occur.

As of 1 July 2008, a new standard in occupant fire safety for the state of Queensland was enacted with the introduction of the Building Fire Safety Regulation 2008. As a result, a due diligence obligation is now placed on all building site management to ensure that they are working toward compliance with the regulation.

HOW PREPARED ARE YOU?

WHAT SHOULD YOUR DIAGRAMS SHOW?

- the place that corresponds to where in the building the diagram is displayed;
- the route from the place where you are standing
- each exit of the building;
- any intercommunication devices in the common areas of the building;
- if fitted, the manually operated fire alarms in the building;
- the fire fighting equipment in the building;
- the designated assembly area for the building;
- the route from each exit shown on the diagram to a designated assembly area.

Installing evacuation diagrams in your building can be as simple as making a phone call.

Guardian Fire Control will come to you, make preliminary drafts and have the finished diagrams prepared in A3 format, laminated and ready for installation within a short space of time.
